

### Community Crisis Center Staff & Board President Receive Community Awards

Board President **Keith Brill** received the **D. Ray Wilson Volunteer Service Award** on May 9, 2018. Presented annually by Judson University, this award is given to the candidate who has contributed to the greater good within the Elgin community by voluntarily serving others' physical, emotional, intellectual or spiritual needs.



Keith works as a comptroller for Clad-Rex Steel in Franklin Park. In 29 years with the Community Crisis, Keith has served on the Board of Directors as Vice-President,

Treasurer and now President. He has participated on many of the Crisis Center's committees, managed the resale shop, and currently assists with the annual Spring Benefit Auction.

In addition to his work with Community Crisis Center, he has worked with the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, Elgin Junior Achievement, Habitat for Humanity, Children's Theatre of Elgin, and computer labs for YWCA-Volunteer Adult Education and Family Literacy Technology.

Keith also assisted with the United Way's Day of Caring, assisted with Elgin Area School District U-46's Career Day, Jane Shower Easter Seals Telethon and Big Brothers Big Sisters. For 26 years he has served as a volunteer tax preparer for the elderly.

**Dr. Kimberly Schellin-Rog**, Coordinator of the Domestic Violence Program at the Community Crisis Center, was chosen by the YWCA to receive the **2018 Marie Grolich Award for Social Service** at their May 10th luncheon.

Kim has been a staff member of the Community Crisis Center since 2002, beginning as an abuse intervention counselor. In 2008 she was promoted to the position of Coordinator of the Sexual Assault Program and in 2012 became the Coordinator of the Domestic Violence Program. Kim coordinates and implements training programs for law enforcement, legal, medical and other service providers and conducts training for staff and professionals regarding Domestic Violence, Elder Abuse, Stalking, Human Trafficking, Sexual Assault and Child Abuse. She also is an adjunct professor at Elgin Community College and Judson University.



Kim exemplifies the qualities of a good leader. She is respectful of every individual, listens to the concerns and needs of clients and staff, encourages growth and strives to meet clinical and ethical standards, all in a professional yet caring manner. Kim has committed herself to the field of women's rights and eradicating violence against women.

# Hospital Advocates—Dedicated Volunteers

When a survivor of either sexual assault or domestic violence comes into a hospital emergency room, often alone, it can be a frightening and traumatizing time.

Enter the Hospital Advocate. Hospital Advocates are trained volunteers with Community Crisis Center, Inc., having received 40 hours of training in both domestic violence and sexual assault, and having observed experienced advocates on several calls.

Once trained, volunteers sign up for a minimum of three 12 hour on-call shifts per month. If called, Hospital Advocates travel to Advocate Sherman or Presence Saint Joseph in Elgin, or Northwestern Medical Delnor Hospital in Geneva immediately to stay with the survivor and assist them during their time of trauma. These calls can come at any time during the night or the day.

These dedicated volunteers provide confidential assistance to the survivor, helping them to assess their safety and offering available help to keep them safe. Hospital Advocates bring with them information on where and how to get counseling, legal advocacy and other services from the Crisis Center. They are also there to provide comfort




and demonstrate to the survivor that someone cares about what has happened to them. The Hospital Advocate is a reassuring voice for the survivor that whatever happened is the fault of the abuser, and that the survivor has nothing to feel guilty about.

If the patient requests, Crisis Center staff will contact them and again offer Crisis Center services.

The Crisis Center is always in need of volunteers with a passion to help survivors of violence.
