Community Crisis Center Nominates Board President Chathia Johnson for Award

Community Crisis Center nominated Board President Chathia Johnson, for the Elgin YWCA Marjorie Leonard Award for Volunteer and Community Service. The Elgin YWCA Leader Luncheon Awards recognize individuals, businesses or organizations who demonstrate outstanding leadership, achievement, and contribution in our community

Ms. Johnson has been involved with the Crisis Center since 2002, first as a program volunteer, then as a volunteer at Reruns, the Crisis Center resale store. Since 2006 she has been a member of

the Board of Directors, presently serving as Board President.

Chathia has offered to the Crisis Center her volunteer skills – a willingness to do whatever she can to help. In addition she has offered her leadership skills to both her work on the board and in bringing the message of the Crisis Center to her Sorority, Delta Sigma Theta, where she has served for the past two years as Domestic Violence Initiative Coordinator. Through this initiative she has brought the Sorority and the Crisis Center together in a long-lasting collaborative relationship.

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Affordable Care Act Help Still Available

The Affordable Care Act (Obamacare) enrollment information and outreach has been available at Community Crisis Center, on Thursdays, for over three

months. This help and support will continue every Thursday from 9 am- Noon throughout the summer months. Certified Navigator/Illinois In Person Assister from VNA Health Care, Mitch Esterino, will be on hand to answer questions or **enroll** anyone eligible for The Act.

Persons having a life change (employment, disability, etc.) are eligible to make changes now.

Prior to now, over 80 people have come seeking information, while over 30 people/families have been enrolled in health care. Residents and their families, employees and their fami-

ly/friends and friends of the Center have all taken advantage of the enrollment.

Medicaid enrollments continue all year long. The Marketplace will reopen for year 2, in Nov. 2014. Call the Crisis Center at 847-697-2380 to set up an appointment.



Sexual Assault Awareness Month Recap

During the month of April, the Sexual Assault Department sponsored a number of open education sessions at Elgin Community College, along with information tables at ECC, Judson University and three area libraries. The culminating event took place on April 23 with the Take Back the Night Rally, sponsored by Community Crisis Center, SWANS (Students Who are Not Silent), Workforce Transitions, and ECC Student Life.

At the rally, three speakers

told their compelling stories of assault and healing: Vicki Rae Thorne, a survivor of date rape shared how her silence and that initial loss of consent, negatively affected 40 years of her life, and how she found her way back to strength, joy, and authenticity. Michael D. Hoffman, the author of Acts of Recovery: The Story of One Man's Ongoing Healing from Sexual Abuse by a Priest, spoke of his trauma and recovery after abuse from one whom he had trusted. The final speaker was

Anny Donewald, the founder of Eve's Angels, a non-profit organization that assists women in the sex industry to find hope through the love of God.

After hearing these inspiring stories, the group marched through the ECC Campus to "Take Back the Night."



Erin's Law Takes Effect in Local School Districts

Erin's Law, named for Erin Merryn, was passed by the State of Illinois Legislature in 2013. Erin was sexually abused by both a neighbor and a cousin when she was a child but did not know what to do about it.

After going public about her abuse, Merryn made it her mission to advocate in favor of ensuring that children have the age-appropriate education to recognize and talk about sexual abuse. Her efforts have led to passage of a version of "Erin's Law" in several states, including her home state

of Illinois.

Erin's Law says that the Comprehensive Health Education Program must require age-appropriate sexual abuse and assault awareness and prevention education in grades pre-kindergarten through 12. It also

requires training of school staff on the recognition and prevention of sexual abuse along with any needed assistance, referral, or resource information for a child of abuse to continue to be successful in school.

Sexual Assault Educators have been working with local school districts to educate them on Erin's Law and provide resources for implementation.

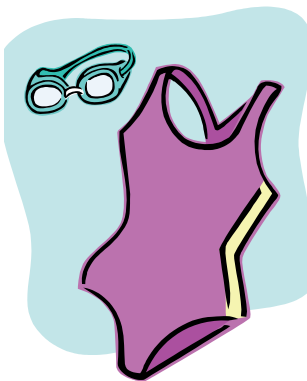
Our cupboard is getting bare, we can use:
